Always destined to win this fight,*

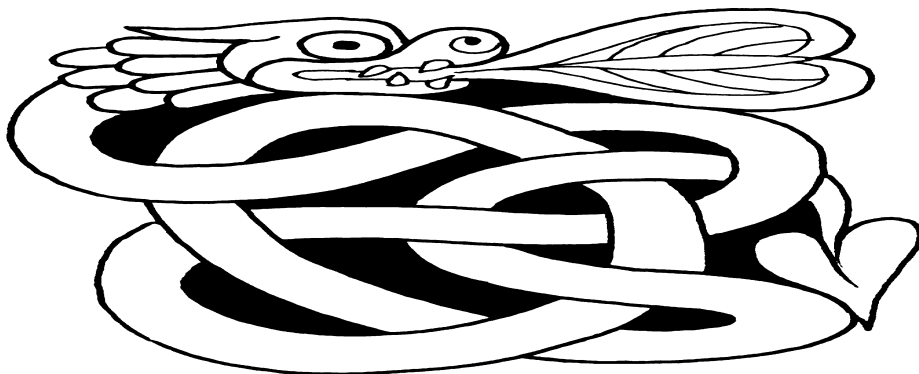
*Tomase he did his job right well,
