Important Announcement for all fighters and their consorts who plan to participate in the October Crown Tournament:

In addition to the minimum three events required of each Crown, the victors of October Crown must also attend Lochac's Crown Tournament. The dates for Lochac's First Crown Tournament have been chosen. Crown Tournament will be the Saturday of Rowany Festival. The Crown Tournament will be on March 30, 2002.

Please check the dates to determine if you are able to fulfill the travel requirements should you win. Keep in mind also the necessary time just for the plane flight when calculating. The royalty will be reimbursed for this travel by the Kingdom Travel Fund at the standard rate (50% of plane ticket to a max of \$750 per person during the reign). This means that this reign will incur expenses above the usual. I would encourage everyone to think about the responsibilities of the next Crown.

These events are about Lochac...and their memories...and the Crown of the West must do everything they can to keep these events special.

There will be a statement at the List Table that all fighters must sign for themselves and their consorts. It will state that each fighter and their consort understands that, should they win, they will be required to travel to Lochac for specific events and they understand that this is *NOT* fully reimbursed. The kingdom seneschal is available to answer any questions regarding the requirements for Crown Tourney.

Rules for November Coronet

Unto the populace of Lochac do we Alfar and Liadan send warmest greetings.

It is our wish that November Coronet Tournament in Stormhold will be run slightly differently. The winner of the Coronet Tournament will need to be proficient in several weapon styles. The winner will be the most skilled fighter on the day.

The Tournament will run as the normal single kill 'double elimination', however the 3rd, 5th and 7th rounds will be specific weapons only.

This means that the 3rd round will be Bastard Swords only. The weapons will be supplied from the Royal Armoury and each sword will be identical to each other. The approximate length of the weapons will be 5 feet, with cutting edges and thrusting tip. NO butt spike.

5th round will be 15" diameter buckler and a single handed sword with thrusting tips. The weapons and shields will be supplied from the Royal Armoury and each item will be identical to each other.

7th round will be a poleaxe of approximately 6 feet. The poleaxe will have a thrusting tip, one cutting edge and a butt spike. The weapons will be supplied from the Royal Armoury and each poleaxe will be identical to each other.

The final will be the best of 5 bouts.

1. Bastard Sword
2. Centre Grip round with single-handed Sword
3. Poleaxe
4. Combatant's own choice
5. Combatant's own choice

From the Lochac Registrar – Coronet membership information.

This message is to remind you of some very important Registry information as we approach Spring Coronet. It especially affects two groups: fighters and families, but I encourage all of Lochac to keep reading. The information below is not new; it is how things have been done in Lochac since there was a Lochac - so do not think that the new Registrar has gone power crazed and is making up either new laws or new procedures. On the other hand,

1. I would like this message to reach every fighter in Lochac (at least). Therefore, can you please cross-post this email to any other local SCA lists, bring this information up at Shire/Baronial meetings, put it in your newsletter if there is time, and take it along to fighter trainings throughout Lochac (whether official or not).
2. In order to fight in Spring Coronet, as per Corpora, your membership application must be received by 20 October 2001. This is a Saturday, so in reality, it must be received by 19 October. This means if you thinking about fighting in Spring Coronet, I would strongly recommend you mail your application on Monday 15 October. If you are prepared to gamble on the vagrancies of Australia Post and choose to mail after that date it is your decision, but realize you run the very real risk of being excluded from the Tourney.
3. As per announcements in Pegasus (dating back to January and then throughout the year), there is a new Registrar and the correct address is: PO Box 2232, Queanbeyan NSW 2620. There have also been a number of new membership forms during the year, and as announced in Pegasus several months ago, old forms will no longer be accepted. This means that you need to be paying \$45 for an annual sustaining membership and \$30 for a family membership. New forms will be in the Sept and Oct Pegasus. Unfortunately, the form currently on the website is out of date, but it is due to be updated any minute (literally). If you send the correct payment, I will accept the out-of-date web form. The website is www.sca.org ; click on [The Principality of Lochac] icon, click on [SCA Committee webpage] then click on whichever version of the membership form suits you best. Family members under 18 require both this membership form AND a Minor Indemnity Form. The Minor Indemnity form is NOT AVAILABLE ELECTRONICALLY, but please leave a message on the answering machine or send an email and I will mail one out post-haste. If you require a Minor's form, please ACT TODAY!!
4. Corpora also requires that out of each couple entering the lists ONE must be a sustaining or contributing member. This means that the other person can hold an Associate or Family membership. There is no restriction about which person is the sustaining member. Please look to your own membership status as a couple NOW -: two family memberships do not permit you to be Prince and Princess of Lochac.
5. In order to receive a family membership, it is necessary to have a sustaining member in the family unit first. This means that family membership is really \$75 (\$45 for the sustaining member and \$30 for everyone else, no limit on how many in a family). I would welcome feedback from the populace on how to express this more clearly in the membership form; (40% of family memberships got it wrong this month) -: with the restriction that we must keep the form to one page.
6. Processing time is 4 to 7 weeks. This means if you mail your form on 20 August, you should not even be thinking to yourself, 'where is my membership card?' until 13 October. On the other hand, if you do not receive your card by 20 October, please contact the Registry because mail does go missing (even correctly addressed mail).
7. This means that membership cards for those who are in the October processing, ie everybody

in Lochac who did not mail their application before 17 September, will not be available until after Spring Coronet. Corpora only requires that you be listed in the database of the Registry, not present your membership card at the Lists. The Lists at Spring Coronet will have a print out of current memberships, so if you follow the process, your name will be there and you will be fine to enter. As I did for May Coronet, I am happy to telephone or email those who want to enter the Coronet Tourney to confirm that their membership forms have been received and processed. PLEASE TELL ME if you are one of these people.

8. How last minute can last minute be? I appreciate that circumstances may be such that you do not know until the 20th that you will be able to fight in Spring Coronet. I will accept forms until 5.00pm on Saturday 20 October. I do not have a fax, but forms can be delivered to me at home (ring for the address -: telephone number is in Pegasus and is listed in the white pages for under Stewart in Queanbeyan) and I will take applications over the phone with a credit card payment. At 5.01pm on Saturday 20 October (even if you have been driving up from Stormhold since the morning), it is too late for the Spring Coronet deadline.

No correspondence will be entered into.

TART ON EMBER DAY

Ingredients

½ lb onions	1 oz sugar
½ tsp sage	1 oz raisins
1 tsp chopped parsley	1 tsp cinnamon
½ lb cream cheese	2 pieces stem ginger
3 eggs	pastry for flan case
2 oz butter	

Method

1. Chop the stem ginger as finely as possible.
2. Parboil the onions, sage and parsley in 1 1/2 pts water.
3. Drain and chop finely
4. Mix this with the cheese and the remaining ingredients.
5. Line flan case with pastry, and fill with the mixture.
6. Bake in a medium oven for 20 min or until set.

Hello, and welcome to another edition of How to be Knightly. Today, lesson number 5,291.


